¹² Now when Jesus heard that John was arrested, he went to Galilee. ¹³ He left Nazareth and settled in Capernaum, which lies alongside the sea in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali. ¹⁴ This fulfilled what Isaiah the prophet said:

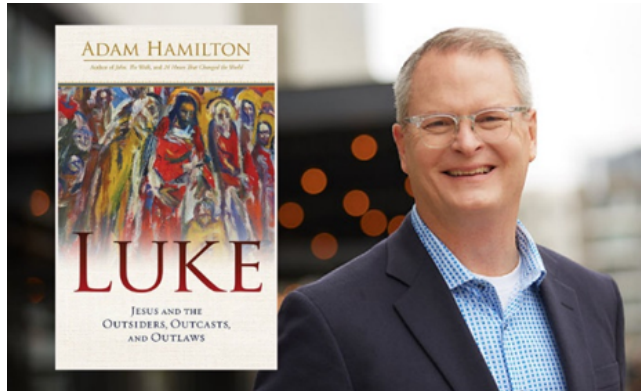

Luke — Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws written by Adam Hamilton.

From Birth to Resurrection in the Gospel of Luke Jesus came to lift up the lowly. Throughout his ministry to his final days on the road to the cross, we find stories of his relationships with ordinary, flawed, and unexpected people. He met, dined, and traveled with people who were not perfect. Many of them were struggling, some were outsiders or even outlaws. Whoever they were, from those he healed to the outlaws with him at his crucifixion, Jesus brought the good news of God's kingdom to those who most needed to hear it. In *Luke: Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws*, pastor and bestselling author Adam Hamilton explores the life, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus as told in the Gospel of Luke. Through Luke's stories we find Jesus' care and compassion for all as he welcomes sinners and outcasts. As we study Luke and see Jesus' concern for those who were considered unimportant, we hear a hopeful and inspiring word for our lives today.

Time With Our Children

Show the children a fishing net and explain how it is used to catch fish. Spread it out and have all the children stand around the edge and hold a part of it. Tell the story of Jesus calling the first disciples, and stress that He started by inviting four fishermen to follow Him. He said, “Follow Me, and I will make you fish for people” (Matthew 4:19). Ask the children why they think He chose four fishermen, and not four carpenters or farmers or shepherds. Suggest that fishermen make good disciples because they are not afraid of taking risks on the water, and you must be brave to be a disciple. Point out that fishermen make good disciples because they work together handling the nets, and you must cooperate with others to be a disciple. Stress that fishermen make good disciples because they are patient as they wait for fish, and you cannot be too anxious as a disciple. Let the children know that Jesus is calling them to follow Him and fish for people as well, and it is important for them to be brave and cooperative and patient if they want to be disciples of Jesus.

January is Cervical Cancer awareness month

The National Cancer Institute projected that approximately 13,360 individuals were diagnosed with cervical cancer in 2025, of those, 4,320 died of the disease.

Cervical Cancer is preventable. Nearly all cases are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV). Males and females ages 9 to 45 should get vaccinated for HPV.

Early detection is key for more effective treatment. The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommends that women should start getting Pap tests every three years, beginning at age 21. From 30 to 65 years of age, they recommend either the Pap test alone every three years and a high-risk HPV test alone every five years. Women can also opt for “co-testing”: both tests every five years. In the past it was not recommended for most women over 65, new studies show that cervical cancer in women older than 65 is unfortunately in a later stage of the disease.

The good news is the FDA has approved the first at-home device for Pap smears! These tests are scheduled to be available nationwide through Teal Health by early 2026.
