Time With Our Children

Kids can participate in Lent through simple, daily actions focused on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Engaging activities include donating toys, doing extra chores, offering daily prayers, practicing kindness, reducing screen time, and participating in Lenten crafts or reading Bible stories. These actions help children understand sacrifice and service.

Acts of Kindness & Almsgiving (Giving)

Donate: Set aside toys, books, or clothes for charity.

Service: Do a sibling's chore, help with dishes, or make someone's bed.

Kindness: Smile at everyone, write letters to veterans or sick relatives, and pay someone a compliment.

Community: Create "blessing bags" for the homeless, feed birds, or pick up litter.

Save: Donate coins from a piggy bank to a church or charity.

Fasting & Self-Discipline (Giving Up)

Screens: Limit video games (e.g., no Roblox or Fortnite on school days) or TV time.

Sweets: Give up candy, soda, or dessert except on Sundays.

Behavior: No complaining, whining, or begging.

Comfort: Give up a favorite chair or blanket or skip headphones.

Prayer & Preparation (Taking Up)

Daily Prayer: Memorize a new prayer or read one Bible story every night.

Devotion: Attend Stations of the Cross, light a candle at church, or make a Lenten paper chain.

Gratitude: Create a jar to list things they are grateful for each day.

Activities: Use a Lenten calendar, make crafts, or "bury the Alleluia" (hiding the word until Easter).

Tips for Success

Keep it Simple: For young kids, choose one small, manageable action per day.

Use Visuals: Put ideas in a jar or hang a checklist on the fridge.

Focus on Love: Emphasize that these actions are to show love for God and others, not just rules.
