


Our Lord's Prayer (unison)







Time with our Children

Luke 1:68-79

Teach the children a simple dance step, such as the box step — so named because the steps rest in the four corners of a square. The leader begins with the left foot and then dances in the following way: first half-box - forward-sidetogether; second half-box — backward-side-together. Let the children know that this is the basic step for the waltz and the rumba, so once they learn it, they can start to do some real dances. But warn them that dances must be learned over time, and they take practice. You cannot become a good dancer simply by reading instructions. Then sit and point out that a man named Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, predicted that God would "guide our feet into the way of peace" (v. 79). Emphasize that we have to learn to move in the way of peace, and it takes practice. So, what could it mean to do the peace dance? Suggest that our feet move in the way of peace when we back away from conflict, when we step toward justice and fairness, and when we take the hands of others and work together. Ask the children to name some ways they do the peace dance in their homes, schools and neighborhoods. Encourage them to keep moving in this way because this is a dance that God wants us all to be doing.
