Time with our Children

Conversations with children about All Saints Day should focus on who saints are, both historical figures and "saints in our lives," and how they exemplify faith, love, and kindness. Explain that saints are ordinary people who followed Jesus and that everyone is called to be a saint by living with faith and love. You can do this by sharing saint stories, asking children to identify saints around them, and discussing how their own actions show faith.

Key concepts

Saints are all around us:

Saints are not just people from long ago with halos, but also family members, friends, and other people who show love and kindness.

Saints are followers of Jesus:

At its core, being a saint means being a follower of Jesus.

• The "cloud of witnesses":

The term "cloud of witnesses" refers to all the faithful people who have died and gone to heaven before us. They are a great example to us, and their souls are still alive and can pray for us.

Saints as examples:

Saints serve as examples of how to live a life of faith. We can learn from their stories and try to follow their example.

How to talk to children about All Saints Day

Start with the basics:

Explain that All Saints Day is a special church day to remember all the people who loved and followed Jesus.

Define "saint":

Break down the word "saint" by explaining it means a person who loves and follows Jesus and has been made holy by God.

Use examples:

- Show pictures of famous saints like Mother Teresa or Martin Luther King Jr. and ask children how they showed love, kindness, and faith.
- Ask children to name saints in their own lives, such as a kind grandparent or a helpful teacher, and discuss what makes them saintly.

Encourage reflection and discussion:

- Ask questions like, "What are some good things saints did?" and "What are some things we can do to be like them?".
- Talk about how their own actions can be saintly, like being kind to a friend or helping a family member.

Connect to the "cloud of witnesses":

Explain that the saints who have died are watching over us, like a supportive cheering section, and that their souls are still alive.

Consider the connection to Halloween:

Some families connect All Saints Day to Halloween by talking about the "saints" in their lives the day after and perhaps using some of their Halloween candy for a special dessert.

Activities for All Saints Day

- Read stories: Read books about the lives of saints or other figures of faith.
- **Draw or make crafts:** Create a "saints" mural with pictures of people who have shown faith, or use craft supplies to make a saint-themed project.
- Sing songs and play games:
 - Sing songs about saints.
- Play games like a saint-themed bingo.
- Make a "Prayer for Saints": You can write a prayer for the saints in your life, or you can light a candle for each one.
- Plant flowers: You can make flower bouquets for people who have recently lost loved ones.
- Host an All Saints party: Have a party with friends and family to celebrate

November is Diabetes Awareness Month Diabetes is a chronic condition that affects how the body regulates blood sugar levels.

Common symptoms of diabetes include:

High blood sugar levels, Increased thirst, Frequent urination, Extreme hunger, Weight loss, Fatigue, and Blurred vision.

Complications:

If not properly managed, diabetes can lead to serious complications, such as:

Heart disease, Stroke, Kidney damage, Nerve damage, Eye problems, and Foot ulcers.

Treatment:

Treatment for diabetes typically involves lifestyle changes (diet, exercise), medication (to improve insulin production or sensitivity), and monitoring blood sugar levels. In some cases, insulin injections may be necessary.

Prevention:

While there is no cure for diabetes, lifestyle changes can help prevent or delay its onset:

Maintain a healthy weight

Engage in regular physical activity

Eat a balanced diet low in processed foods and sugary drinks Manage stress effectively

Quit smoking
