Finding Joy Psalm 100

I can't tell you how important it is for you to find something you love to do. As you are growing up take advantage of opportunities to find out more about the world and about yourself. Whenever you have a chance, go to a concert or a play, take a summer pottery class just for fun, travel with your parents and notice how buildings are built, find out about the food and customs of others. Make things at home. Bake, do crafts, build things, find interesting projects. Try needlework, collect rocks, hike, study the clouds and stars and the animals and fish of the sea. Some of you may have already found activities that excite and delight you. Some children find their special interests very early. I know a little girl who loves to study bugs and a little boy who loved music from the time he was a toddler. November is Diabetes Awareness Month Diabetes is a chronic condition that affects how the body regulates blood sugar levels.

Common symptoms of diabetes include:

High blood sugar levels, Increased thirst, Frequent urination, Extreme hunger, Weight loss, Fatigue, and Blurred vision.

Complications:

If not properly managed, diabetes can lead to serious complications, such as: Heart disease, Stroke, Kidney damage, Nerve damage, Eye problems, and Foot ulcers.

Treatment: Treatment for diabetes typically involves lifestyle changes (diet, exercise), medication (to improve insulin production or sensitivity), and monitoring blood sugar levels. In some cases, insulin injections may be necessary.

Prevention:

While there is no cure for diabetes, lifestyle changes can help prevent or delay its onset:

Maintain a healthy weight

Engage in regular physical activity

Eat a balanced diet low in processed foods and sugary drinks

Manage stress effectively

Quit smoking

Consult a healthcare professional for regular checkups and screenings

If you experience any symptoms of diabetes, seek medical advice promptly
